
What is digital accessibility?

Engine of disablity inclusion in tech

- The difference between inclusion + exclusion for disabled people
- Intentional practices that make inclusion happen
- Privacy, security, safety
 +++ for disabled people
- Essential to DEI and ethics



Digital access is a bridge to everything



Federal framework components


- Federal laws
- Federal regulations based on federal laws
- Federal agency policy statements
- State and local laws and regulations
- Implementation + Enforcement

ADA: Anti-discrimination Effective communication 2024 web + mobile rule Section 504 | 508 CVAA + FCC regulations Air Carriers Access Act ACA section 1557

- Time frame

 But ADA not suspended!
 Virginia Beach same month

Disability rights lawyers

- Disabled advocates + orgs

- Courts are stopping illegal actions
- Complex process for rule change
- Fair judges

What are the remedies if the law is ignored?

Laws include legal remedies



Fix barriers | fix systems Court / Agency oversight DOJ penalties (up to 150K) Pay the disabled person/s Pay disability rights lawyers Pay lawyers to 'defend' EAA fines, market loss, jail

How are Laws Implemented and Enforced?

Who and How?



People with disabilities Government agencies Private party lawsuits Structured Negotiations Covered organizations

Access to Healthcare

UNC Health Care System PRIVATE lawsuit

- \$150,000 from Nash Hospital (damages + fees)
- \$125,000 from UNC Health (damages)
- 3-year injunction against UNC Health to provide equally effective access to patient communications within entire UNC Health network
- More than \$1.2 million in attorneys' fees to plaintiffs' lawyers

Access to education

LACCD (private party)
\$240,000 verdict (2023)
Verdict reduction + weak injunction (2024)
Earlier settlements as roadmaps

- UC Berkeley
- Harvard | MIT
- Miami University Ohio



Voting (DOJ and private parties)



The web site numbers -2024!

- 4,224 cases filed
 961 against defendants already sued
- 99% about desktop websites
- 1,023 against companies using an overlay

- False Claims Act
- Contractor + the web dev + subcontractor
- Resolved!!
 - Two million dollars
 - Fix barriers

Taking on an Overlay Company

- Tribeca Skin Care vs. AccessiBe
- Breach of contract
- Breach of "good faith and fair dealing"
- Resource: LFLegal.com



Risk to legal remedies and enforcement



No DOJ / US Attorney action

- No Statement of Interest
- No Guidance
- No lawsuits
- No settlements
- No investigation of agency complaints. No agency?!

Harmful DOJ action

 Possible ADA change to lawsuit remedy

Where's the power : remedies + enforcement

- Private enforcement
- State enforcement
 - (NY Attorney General in 2009!)
- Orgs doing the right thing
- Disability community advocacy
